She stated she had already addressed the Yolo County Board of Supervisors but wanted to address the Fire Department Commissioners as well. Her main concern is over the bike path. Ms. Pfanner asked the Board to re-evaluate their position and to do further research in regard to the safety of the bike riders and pedestrians.

6. NEW BUSINESS

a. Discussion/Action – Fire District Personnel Reserved Parking. Commissioner Beoshanz voiced his concerns over the lack of parking available next to the Fire Station during meetings. He stated he would like to see signs that say the area in front of the Fire Station door is reserved for Fire Personnel.

Commissioner Yeager stated that the Hall Manager was going to let the renters know that on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, they would have to keep the area in front of the Fire Station free for the Commissioners and others that attend the Board of Commissioner meeting.

Ideas regarding possible signage were discussed and it was noted that the Fire Department personnel park on the north side of the Fire Station. Assistant Chief Heins also informed the Board that the rental agreement for the Hall included the parking.

By consensus it was agreed to have the Hall Manager ask the renters on the 3rd Tuesdays each month, not park in front of the Fire Station.

b. Discussion/Action – California Minimum Wage Adjustment for Volunteers 2019. Assistant Chief Heins reminded the Board that the volunteers are paid per call and by hour on projects the same hourly rate. Due to the increase in minimum wage he asked that the hourly rate be increased as follows:

Non-drivers from \$11 to \$12 per call and hourly for special projects. Drivers from \$12 to \$13 per call and hourly for special projects.

Discussion/Action – Volunteer Application Assistant Chief Heins informed the Board that there was a volunteer firefighter applicant that lived outside of the secondary boundary for volunteers. Assistant Chief Heins reminded the Board of the boundaries; North to County Road 24 and East to Lake Boulevard. He stated that the applicant was an EMT and would be willing to do duty shifts and drills. Chief Rita reminded the Board that there would be no cost for insurance since we have YCPARMIA. The candidate can also provide relief on extended calls.

Fire Station Door Repair Update Assistant Chief Heins informed the Board he had found a structural engineer through a volunteer that is willing to do the work needed at no cost but has not been able to meet yet. Commissioner Yeager suggested that he look at whether there is insurance that will cover the repair. Since this is more than just the station door repair, it was agreed to rename this item to Fire Station Structural issues. Will update at next meeting.

8. CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Rita informed the Board of a few items

- FDAC Conference is April 3 5 in Napa, CA. Chief Rita stated that she had no rooms scheduled as staff could not attend this year. The Commissioners stated that they could not attend either.
- Mark Krummenacker has stated that he would be willing to put together a 5-year historical listing of our trends of fund balances and to confirm our balances from the statements from the start of this fiscal year for \$50/hr. and estimates 5-7 hours.
