I represent the West Plainfield Fire Protection District Board of Commissioners in this communication. At the Board of Commissioners meeting of March 20th, 2018, the commissioners discussed and determined that the intersection of County Roads 31 and 96 is a hazardous intersection. There have been several accidents and at least 2 that were fatal at that intersection.

Additionally, the commissioners discussed and determined that the speed limit on County Road 96, between County Road 30 and Russell creates a hazard to the people and properties located on County Road 96, due to the limited site visibility created by foliage and the fact that many horse and riders are entering the roadway without being seen until the last seconds from drivers. This situation is compounded by drivers rushing their children in vehicles to the elementary school down County Road 96 at Russell.

I would be happy to accompany you or your representative during your site inspections of the two hazardous conditions, noted above.

Minutes – April 6, 2018 West Plainfield Fire Protection District – Personnel Committee

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:18 pm by Commissioner Hjerpe. Present were:

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

None

3. PERFORMANCE REVIEW - BOARD CLERK

Commissioner Hjerpe made some opening remarks, summarized as follows: the rate of inflation since the Clerk's starting wage in 2008 is 15.39% and this is the Board Clerk's first formal review. Factoring for rate of inflation on the \$17.50 hourly wage, the Board Clerk would need to receive \$2.69 per hour more than the position is currently receiving.

The Committee members also reviewed the Board Clerk's pay from Jan 1, 2015, to the present. On average, the cost to the District is \$5,010.40 annually, and the Clerk receives \$3,829.20 net annually.

Commissioner Hjerpe advised Clerk Grafton that she was entitled to request that the performance review be held in closed session. Clerk Grafton indicated she was fine with having an open session performance review.

The question, "Who is the Clerk's immediate supervisor?" came up. A review of the Clerk's job description seems to indicate that the Board President is. The Committee members concurred that the question should be definitively answered by the Board and the job description updated to clearly identify the Clerk's immediate supervisor. In the meantime, it was agreed that since the Board President had directed the Committee to perform the review, they were authorized to do so as the appointee of the Board President.

During the Clerk's performance review, the Committee members utilized the job description. it was noted that the job description needs to be updated to reflect the position as "Board Clerk" and not "Board Secretary." The Clerk also asked about the item "Within 2 days after a Board meeting, regular or special, prepare and provide an updated list of action items" She indicated she had been told some time ago that she no longer needed to provide that document.

The Committee, the Clerk and Chief Rita and AC Heins worked to provide the Clerk with goals and objectives. The Committee concurs that Clerk Grafton should receive a satisfactory review and would be entitled to a pay raise, at the Board's discretion.

By Consensus the Committee members recommend to the Board that:

- a. The Board Clerk's job performance be reviewed annually
- b. Clerk Grafton receive a satisfactory job performance review
- c. The Board direct that Section 210 be revised to correctly reflect that:
 - a. The position is known as the Board Clerk
 - b. The Board Clerk's immediate supervisor be clearly identified

- c. Remove the requirement for preparation of "action items" if that is the Board's desire
- d. The Board President task the Budget Committee to review all current pay scales to determine if they should be adjusted and, if so, to what extent the District can afford to do so. Of immediate concern: both the Relief Firefighters and the Board Clerk receive the same hourly wage. If the Board Clerk receives an increase in salary, should the Relief Firefighters also, and if so, how much should each receive.


